## WALKER: PLAY-OFFS ARE STILL THE GOAL - !

Yorkshire Jets Co-Captain Joanne Walker declared play-offs are still the goal, despite her team missing out on the top four as a result of a narrow loss to Team Bath on Friday night.

The game ended in controversy however when the scoreboard cut out in the dying minutes resulting in a dispute over the final deficit.

Bath required a four goal victory to overhaul Celtic Dragons in fourth place and the defeat means Jets finished sixth and will play in the bottom four – along with Loughborough, Team Northumbria and Dragons – after the super-split, with the highest placed team earning a berth in the play-offs.

Walker said after the match: “Now we’re in the bottom four our only aim is fifth spot and to win every game home and away.



“We feel like we should already be in the top four after leading by as many as we did and this has made us all more determined than ever to reach the play-offs.

“This was the first time we’ve had such a good third quarter but once again we lost concentration, only this time in the fourth.

“All credit to Bath they took advantage of this and went on to win the game.”

## REGIONAL SCHOOL NETBALL COMPETITION ‘END OF AN ERA’

The outgoing committee responsible for providing schools competition for thousands of netballers every year for over three decades were commended at the Yorkshire & Humberside regional round of the National Schools Competition.

Christine Stephen who started attending Regional Schools’ meetings way back in 1976 then took over as Secretary in June 1978, a position she has held ever since, has been involved with the organisation of the Regional Round since January 1979 which means that this was her 34th year of coordinating this prestigious event. All the teachers and umpires that have been involved are fully aware of how well-organised this event has always run under Christine’s efficiency and eye for detail! In addition to her superb administration Christine has represented Yorkshire & Humberside in so many different roles and also on national panels as well as England Selector, and even Vice President of ESNA.

Gordon Padley, who has been involved in school netball in various roles for over 40 years, has always been a mainstay and guiding support on the Regional Schools Committee. He has shared his wealth of experience from years of service on national and international netball panels with the early group of Gill McGarvie, Pat Devine and Christine right through to the present trio running these events for the last 15 years of himself, Christine and Chair (and ex treasurer) Helen Thorneloe. Not only has he served the Regional & National committees throughout his time but he was also a leading umpire and was presented with a sterling silver whistle by ESNA in 1982 when he became the first male to umpire the England Under 16 international matches England v Wales and England v Scotland. ‘One of the principle highlights for me was when we, as an English Schools Netball Association region, hosted the national schools finals at Thorne Grammar School,’ said Gordon.

Over the past 30-40 years the Regional Schools Committee has:

Hosted the ESNA National Schools Finals at Thorne Grammar School, Doncaster

Organised the Regional Schools’ Under-15 and Under-13 Tournament to emulate the National Schools Regional Round from 1995-2011, adding Under-12 for the first time last year

From 1986-1994 organised the Regional Trials at Under-19 and Under-16 level which was then was the recognised route to National trials.

Organised for several years an annual Y&H Inter-Counties Tournament at Under-19; Under-16 and Under-14 level (1982 to 1993)

Organised a very successful and innovative annual Y&H Netball Residential Summer School for 4 years (1985-1990)

Been involved in the organisation of several Spotlights in the Y&H Region including International matches at ESNA Under -19 and England Under-16 level.

Been involved with the FENA U/16 Tournament in Sheffield 1991

Brought the Alex Barlass Inter-Counties Tournament for Under-19 and Under-16 County teams to Harrogate and Knaresborough, North Yorkshire in 1992.

Sheffield High School Under 14 netball team have qualified for the National Netball Finals for the second year running!

The Under 14 team are now training hard for the National Finals which are to be played on Saturday 17 March at Basildon Sporting Village. Here they meet the top two teams from all of the nine regions in England to play off for the National trophy.

The Sheffield High School teams had qualified in all three age groups as U14, U16 and U19 South Yorkshire Champions through to the regional round which was held at Ashville in Harrogate.

The U19 team were placed 5th overall in Yorkshire & Humberside and the U16 team narrowly missed qualifying for the National Finals by 2 goals! The Under 14 team won all but the last game, losing by only one goal to Leeds so qualified through to the Nationals in runner up position

The Under-12's enjoyed the warmth and space of the Sports hall and the little ones all seemed to have enjoyed a good morning of Netball.

Thanks go to Cath Johnson and Jan Hemsley for their on-site preparation and to the other staff and the girls from GSAL who helped to ensure that the Tournament ran smoothly. The timekeepers did a sterling job for us!

Congratulations to all the teams and to their coaches who seemed to have got the balance between competition and participation just right. There were some instances of real sporting spirit and it was particularly encouraging that many teams did stay until the very end of the Tournament to congratulate the winning teams.

There were 6 teams in the Under-12 Tournament. Teams played in a Round Robin and, apart from the GSAL games, there were narrow wins and losses. GSAL stormed through their matches, scoring a massive 84 goals and only conceding 6. Congratulations on winning this age group.

As in the Under-12 section, GSAL proved to be the dominant team, only meeting real opposition in the Final where Wakefield fought well to only lose 7-12. The Play-off for 3rd and 4th place was evenly matched; the final score between Sheffield High and Bradford ending in a draw 7-7.

It was only in the Under-15 Final that the Sheffield girls in particular were really challenged. An exciting final between Sheffield and Bradford ended in a draw of 7-7. Hymers closely beat Wolfreton for 3rd and 4th place.

## 68 WEST YORKSHIRE NETBALL TEAMS BATTLE IT OUT IN PINK AT CHARITY NETBALL EVENT



**Charity Fun day in aid of Jo's Cervical Cancer Trust**

On Saturday 4 February 2012 the West Yorkshire County Netball League got 'in the pink' to raise money for Jo's Cervical Cancer Trust, the only UK charity dedicated to women and their families affected by cervical cancer and cervical abnormalities. The aim of the charity is to provide information and support to women of all ages.

On 3 November 2011 Clare Turton, from Hebden Bridge, lost her battle against cervical cancer, aged only 37. Clare was a buyer at Wm Morrison Supermarkets and was a founder member of the Morrison's Ladies netball team who play in Division 4 of the West Yorkshire County League. Clare was diagnosed with cervical cancer in 2010 and during her 18 month battle wished to

raise the awareness and funds for this form of cancer.

In memory of Clare, 68 teams played 'in pink' taking part in fundraising activities to raise awareness of, and raise lots of money for, this worthwhile cause. All players will be paying to play. At seven venues around the county from Halifax to Garforth and Bradford to Normanton, teams were challenged to ditch their normal sportswear for anything pink (as long as the items are not likely to cause injury) for a small fee!!

Local Supermarket Retailers Wm Morrison Supermarkets have kindly donated gift packs which include power sport drinks, chocolate bars and dove deodorant. In addition, there was 'guess the goals' competitions for the number of goals scored at each venue and also overall in the county on the day. Prizes include an internet android tablet and a Spa day for two, all of which were donated in order to raise as much money as possible for Jo's Trust.

## ROCKETS LAUNCH IN RIPON!



Ripon Rockets was launched in September 2011 and now has 71 Junior Members. The club was formed to give the opportunity for girls in Ripon to embrace netball and enjoy a

friendly environment in which to train and compete. We have girls travelling every Saturday from as far as Middlesbrough, Richmond and the surrounding villages of Ripon and Harrogate.

All our coaches are committed to the children's continuous development and their own, attending coaching and umpiring qualifications and regular England Netball skill specific workshops. We are lucky to have a level 3 and Level 2 coach and two level 1's working towards a level 2 qualification in Spring this year.

We train at Ripon Grammar School in their excellent indoor and outdoor facilities on a Saturday afternoon with age groups ranging from under 11's (Hi 5) to under 16's. In addition we will run B2N after Easter encouraging local players, specifically targeting the 16 - 25 age group as well as Mums, Aunties, friends of our club to create senior squads, which will enter the Harrogate Summer League and Winter league in both Harrogate and York NYNAL league in September 2012.

We wanted to give the girls a taste of competition and entered 3 teams in the North Yorkshire County competition in York and our U12s were successful and will go through to the Regional Festival in June. In addition all our teams were commended by the officials for their team spirit and commitment, which made our coaching team very proud.



Continued.....This has encouraged the club to be instrumental in the creation of a Harrogate Junior League, which has been supported by HDNL with a range of mini tournaments for all age groups and an official League will be launched in September 2012. We will host a Hi 5 festival in February and April for our Ripon Rockets under 11s and have invited teams from Harrogate clubs and schools to compete in a friendly but competitive environment.

Ripon Rockets is not just a club to play netball our aim is to encourage all members to participate in netball at every level. We will be running a Youth Umpiring qualification in March. The girls are encouraged to pick up a whistle at training and our under 16's regularly help coach at our Under 11 training sessions.

We are in the process of applying for Bronze CAPs accreditation. We are fortunate to have a fantastic team of qualified coaches and officials together with a devoted club committee who have a passion for netball. It has been a great five months and it looks like a bright future ahead with sponsorship secured from parents for squad kit and plans to fund raise for equipment and a trip to watch the England Netball Team play later this year.
